It might be helpful for you to know how I view the role of Interim Pastor. I understand that I have several functions. One thing an Interim is expected to do is to assure that the congregation has a continuity of pastoral leadership. This is not a problem for The Holy Way, because of the excellent continuing leadership of Pastor Elizabeth, and I'm honored to join her in leading this wonderful family of faith.

A second role of an Interim is to examine the processes and systems at work in the congregation. Particularly in situations in which a called Pastor has served for a long time, systems can usefulness. outlive their preferences can become rules. A good Interim will look at these systems, learn how the system came to be in place, and facilitate the process of evaluating whether or not this system is the best one for the church moving forward.

Because of this role, I'll be spending a fair amount of time asking questions like, "Why do we do it this way?" or "Is there a different or better way of accomplishing this task?" When you hear me asking these kinds of questions, please don't hear them as criticisms. I'm just going to be helping the congregation discover what is being done because it best meets our needs and what is being done because we've just always done it.

A third role of the Interim is to celebrate the past of the congregation and to prepare for an exciting future with a called Pastor. I will be serving here for a limited period of time, and I'll do my best to accomplish the work I was called here to do. While I'm here I'll commit to being the very best Interim Pastor I'm capable of being, and I'd welcome your prayers.
